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EDITORIAL

The trustees of Sarvodaya Samaj established Sarvodaya Vidyalaya in 1969. This is the first private Gujarati Medium School in Chembur. To begin with, the School did not have its own building and was started with a classrooms provided by **Swami Vivekananda School** at Chembur. The trustees appealed to their friends for donations for the school building. Response was extremely good. In December 1974, the school building war was started. Trustees gave person attention to the building work with full dedication and self sacrifice. Essential facilities have been provided in the school. The staff, students and parents co-operated a lot and bore all hardships along with the trustees during the transit phase.

The school and College is managed through the school committee and college committee that keeps in mind the basic aims and objectives of the trust and follows department rules and regulations while running the school and college. Admissions are given to all pupils making no distinctions of caste, creed and relation. Donations are not raised from the pupils for admissions or any other purpose at any stages.

' **Sarvodaya Vidyalaya**' began with hard days. With the support of staff, students (past and present) and well wishers, a paradise has been created at Sarvodaya Vidyalaya.

In 1991 Bhavna Trust has started computer classes to give knowledge of computer to all the students, from standard I to standard X for that an ultra modern computer laboratory was set up with 10 computers till to- day it is running successfully.

In the year 1997 Bhavna Trust obtained a permission to start Junior College of Arts & Commerce, which was attached to our Mehta Sarvodaya Vidyalaya Gujarati Medium and it started Junior College of Commerce named Mehta Sarvodaya Junior College of Commerce. This college was started with a view that students who passed

S.S.C. from our school need not go in other college and students can take admission in Junior College. This has helped our students a lot because a student's of this school, do not have to run from one college to other for admission and do not have to pay any donation.

The ultimate aim of **Bhavna Trust** was to provide education to needy students from Junior KG to Degree. The aim was, a child who takes admission in Junior KG should complete his/her education up to graduation in one premises only. With a view **Bhavna Trust** obtained a permission to open a degree college of B.Sc. (Computer) and Degree College of Commerce in the year 2003 and it started its degree college in the year 2003 B.Sc. (IT) in the year 2007 & B.M.S. (2008).

All the parents have to worry about their children's education admission at 3 stage Junior KG, after passing S.S.C. in Junior College and after completing Junior College, admission in degree college, parents who have undergone the worries at these 3 stages they know how difficult it is to get an admission at all the 3 stages. **Bhavna Trust** has come forward and established such a trust amongst parents that now they know that those days are over and they did not worry about the admission of their children not only that Bhavna Trust knows about the modern technology and by keeping in mind it has started degree college in computer. Two ultra modern computer labs were set up to give better education to students library is opened for the students with all the required books available. Advanced computer classes have also been opened and for recreation purpose sports gymkhana is also opened. Bhavna Trust has opened open College of bachelor of Management Science in 2008. Ultra modern Physics, Chemistry & Biology laboratories are set-up with all the required apparatus.

COLLEGE RULES

1. DISCIPLINE

- Wearing Identity Card is compulsory in the college campus.
- Should be present in college well in time. Latecomers will not be allowed in the class.
- Should not loiter in the corridors or in the college premises particularly when classes are going on.
- Strict discipline should be maintained in the college campus.
- Should behave decently with staff members & each other.
- Should bring only the parent/guardian whose details are given in the Parent's profile submitted in the College when called. Any change in the parent/guardianship should be informed to the College office immediately.
- Should not cause any damage to the College property and also keep the College premises clean and neat. Students found damaging the property is liable to be rusticated from the College and the cost of damages will be collected from such students.
- In all disputes & controversial matters, decision of the Principal & the appropriate authorities shall be final & binding on the students as well as on the parents & guardians.
- Smoking, Tobacco chewing, Spitting etc. are strictly prohibited according to the Government orders.

2. ATTENDANCE

- For granting the terms in each semester it is mandatory for every learner to have minimum 75% average attendance of total number of lectures, practical's, tutorials, etc. and a minimum of 50% attendance for each subject (0.6086).
- Attendance defaulters list will be put up on the Attendance Notice Board in the first week of every month for the period up to the previous month and warning letters will be issued to the defaulting learners twice in every semester.
- Student shall not be absent from tests or tutorials & examinations without prior permission from the Principal.

3. DRESS CODE

- Students must be neatly and modestly dressed in the College premises.

4. **CELL PHONES**

- Use of cell phones in any form in the class rooms while in session is strictly prohibited. On breach of this discipline, the cell-phone holder will be liable for a penalty of Rs. 500/- In case of a repetition of the offence the cell-phone shall be liable to confiscation.

5. **RAGGING**

- Students shall not form any group or union in the college & shall not invite any person to address a meeting without prior permission from the Principal.
- Students should refrain from ragging within or outside the College premises. Government of Maharashtra by resolution no. tern/1 0967620/96 dated 06-09-1996 has notified ragging as a cognizable offence. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within or outside the College campus shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment and fine. Any student convicted shall be dismissed from the College and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal. The following are some of the ingredients of ragging, which are punishable under the court of law as per the "UGC Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009":
 - i. Abetment to ragging,
 - ii. Criminal conspiracy to rag
 - iii. Unlawful assembly and rioting
 - iv. Public nuisance created during ragging
 - v. Violation of decency and moral thought
 - vi. Injury to body
 - vii. Wrongful restrain
 - viii. Wrongful confinement
 - ix. Use of criminal force
 - x. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences
 - xi. Extortion
 - xii. Criminal trespass
 - xiii. Offences against property
 - xiv. Criminal intimidation, etc.

6. **ADMISSION**

- Eligible students have to apply' online for seeking admission to First Year Undergraduate Classes as directed by the University.
- Admissions will be on merit as per prevailing University rules & Government norms and will be provisional till confirmed by the authorities.

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- Students have to take admission each year. Admission is based on availability of seats, attendance and performance in the lower class. A repeater or an ATKT student may not be admitted to the next class in case of non-availability of seats.
- Students seeking admissions from other colleges to this College, should have passed in all subjects and obtain No Objection Certificate (N.O.C.) from last College attended.
- Ordinances relating to refund of fees for the college in all the faculties from the:
 - i. Date of admission to 7th day 100% refund (less administrative charges)
 - ii. Date of admission to the 10th day (50% refund)
 - iii. After that no fees will be refunded.

Principal has the absolute right to add, amend or modify the above rules.

1. Admissions to B.Com class:

- Eligibility for F.Y. B.Com: a student should have passed Std. XII i.e. the higher secondary certificate examination conducted by the Mumbai board and the Maharashtra state board of secondary and higher secondary education or an examination recognized as equivalent.
- Candidates, who have passed the HSC or other qualifying examination from other than Maharashtra board of HSC examination, should produce eligibility certificate from the University of Mumbai along with the application for admission, failing which their applications are liable to be rejected.
- All Admissions are provisional, and are liable to be cancelled if their eligibility/enrolment is not confirmed by the University of Mumbai.
- Admissions secured on the basis of incorrect or false information are liable to be cancelled.
- Eligibility For S. Y. B.Com: Semesters I & II Pass or A.T.K.T
- Eligibility For T. Y.B.Com :Semester I,II,III&IV pass ,or pass in semester I&II and ATKT in Semester III & IV, or pass in Semester III & IV and A.T.K.T. in Semester I & II.
- In case the admission of the student is found to be invalid for any reason, the responsibility will lie with the student. Students will account for the gap, if any, between H.S.C. and joining F.Y.B.Com.by submitting gap certificate, N.O.C. &T.C. from previous institute.
- Admissions will not be granted to any student on the basis of marks obtained alone but other important considerations like his /her behavior, character and aptitude will be taken into account.

2. Documents required for admission:

Students require the following documents in original along with duly attested photocopies for verification at the time of admission:

- (I) I) Original mark sheet of H.S.C. along with two photo copies and original H.S.C. leaving certificate along with one photo copy for F.Y.BCOM admission.
- II) Photo Copies of Semester I and II mark sheets for S.Y.BCOM admission.
- III) Photocopies of Semester I, II, III &IV mark sheets for TYBCOM admission.

- IV) For New Admission at S.Y.B. Com – NOC with enrollment details to be produced from the previous college.
- V) Three recent stamp size photographs (one on the application form. One on the parent profile form and one for identity card)
- II) Parents profile duly filled with a photograph of the parent/guardian.
- III) Students and parents undertaking in respect of discipline & attendance.
- IV) Caste Certificate (if applicable)
- V) Documentary evidence regarding special category status.
- VI) Eligibility Certificate (Students coming from other than Maharashtra Board and Maharashtra Technical Board)
- VII) Physically handicapped candidates should produce the relevant Certificate from competent authority.

Note: In case the original mark sheet of H.S.C. has been submitted for

Admission to any other college, a certificate to that effect, signed by the Principal of the college must be produced.

Attendance is compulsory as per the university rules mentioned earlier. Cumulative attendance percentages of all the learners shall be displayed on the college attendance notice board on first Saturday of every subsequent month. Parents/ guardians are requested to see the college attendance notice board to check their wards attendance.

5.1 Scheme of Examination:

The performance of the learners shall be evaluated into two components viz. by Internal Assessment with 25% marks in the first component and by conducting the Semester End Examination with 75% marks as the second component. The allocation of marks for the Internal Assessment and semester End Examinations are as shown below:

A. Internal Assessment -25%

B. Semester End examination-75%

- i. Duration- These examinations shall be of 2 Hours 30 Minutes duration.
- ii. Question Paper Pattern:
 1. There shall be five questions each of 15 marks.
 2. All questions shall be compulsory with internal choice within the questions.

Responsibility of Assessment:

- i) The assessment of Part "A" and "B" i.e. Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination as mentioned above for the Semester I to IV shall be processed by the College and issue the grade cards to the learner after the conversion of marks into grade.
- ii) The assessment of Part "A" i.e. Internal Assessment as mentioned above for the Semester V & VI shall be processed by the College while University shall conduct the assessment of Part "B" i.e. the Semester End Examination for Semester V & VI. The Internal Assessment marks of learners appearing for Semester V & VI shall be submitted to the University by the College before the commencement of Semester End Examinations. The results shall be declared by the university after processing the marks obtained by the learner in the Internal Assessment and the marks obtained by the learner in the Internal Assessment and the marks awarded to the learners in Semester End Examination. The grade card shall be issued by the University after converting the marks into grades.

5.2 Standard of Passing and Performance Grading:

Standard of Passing: The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e. 10 out of 25) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 30 out of 75) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E in each project wherever

applicable to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination together.

The performance grading shall be based on the aggregate performance of Internal Assessment and semester End Examination.

Note: There is a possibility of having 100 marks examination in each paper at the end of each semester by scrapping the internal assessment for 25 marks each and introducing two full live projects of 100 marks each as part of the curriculum in the final year. To bring uniformity in paper pattern and exam system, the university across all affiliated colleges, even in first year and second year degree examinations.

The change, if any, in rules regarding examination will be notified for information of students, as and when received from the University.

A learner who fails in some or all the courses can appear for A.T.K.T examination which will be conducted only in the month of October & April of every year for all Semesters i.e. Semester I, II, III & IV.

5.3 Carry Forward of Marks in Case if the Learner Fails in One or More Courses:

- 1) A learner who passes in the Internal Examination but fails in the Semester End Examination of the Course shall reappear for the Semester End Examination of that course. However his/her marks of the Internal Examinations shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.
- 2) A learner who passes in the Semester End Examination but fails in the Internal Assessment of the course shall reappear for the Internal Examination of that course. However his/her marks of the Semester End Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.
- 3) In case of learner who is reappearing for the Internal Examination, the examination will consist of one project of 25 marks which will be divided into 15 marks for the documentation of the project, 5 marks for the presentation and 5 marks for the viva and the interaction.

5.4 Allowed To Keep Terms (ATKT):

- 1) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number of courses of fail in the Semester I.
- 2) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester III if he/she passes each of Semester I & II.

OR

A learner fails in not more than two courses each of Semester I & II.

- 3) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester IV irrespective of number of courses of failure in Semester III.
- 4) A learner shall allowed to keep term for Semester V if he/she passes Semester I, II, III, IV.

OR

A learner shall pass Semester I & II and fails in not more than two courses each of Semester III& IV.

OR

A learner shall pass semester III & IV and fails in not more than two courses each of semester I & II

- 5) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for semester VI irrespective of number of courses of failure in the semester V.
- 6) The learner can appear for the semester VI examination but the result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, II, III, IV & V.

Third Year B.Com: TYB.Com examinations will be conducted by the University as per the dates announced in the month of October, 2016 & March/April 2017 for 75 marks. The examination shall be of 2 hours 30 minutes duration.

Internal assessment for 25 marks will be conducted as per the prescribed pattern mentioned earlier.

Only those students get the min. 75% of attendance at the lectures (0.6086) are eligible to appear for the examination

Facilities to handicapped students, etc. for examination: students suffering from Dyslexia, Dyspraxia & Dyscalculia or are visually/ impaired /low vision/ physically challenged are

requested to contact college office to obtain details about the facilities available to them for exams. They are required to produce the relevant documents to avail the benefits.

Facility of verification, giving of photocopy and revaluation of the answer books : the facility to obtain Photocopies of assessed and/ or moderated answer books/ by the examinee is / are extended with a view to bring transparency in the examination system and ensure its credibility. This facility shall be for the theory papers only of the exams held.

The prescribed application form for obtaining photocopy (of answer books will be supplied on the payment of non- refundable fee of Rs. 100/ per answer book (50% concession for reserve category examinees). The application should be submitted to the office within the due date specified in a notice to be put up after declaration of results.

The College shall endeavor to supply photo copy of answer books within 7days from the date of receipt of

Application On receipt of photo copies, the applicant examinee shall be the sole custodian of it. Them and under no circumstances they shall be transferred to any third person or for any other purpose .It shall be his /her exclusive and relevant use. He/she can use it only for the purpose of getting the redressal of the grievances through the redressal mechanism provided by the college. Any deviation from this procedure by the applicant shall be construed as an unfair act on the part of the examinee and shall make him/her liable for appropriate punishment by the college.

If the examinee is not satisfied with the marks awarded to him/her by the original examiner, he/she may apply for redressal of grievances to the college. The prescribed application form duly filled in shall be submitted within 7 days from the date of the receipt of the concerned photo copies with a fee of Rs.250 per paper to the college (50% concession for reserve categories).

The examinee shall have to mention clearly in the application form, the reasons of his/her grievances and specify clearly question wise his/her points of objection to the valuation done with proper justification. The applications for redressal of grievances received after the last date shall not be accepted by the College under any circumstances, whatsoever.
