ADMISSIONS

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. Admission to the Degree College can be given to the applicants who have completed their 10+2 Maharashtra State Board Exam or any other recognized equivalent Board / Authority.
2. Admission to the Junior College is open to applicants who have completed their standard X from Maharashtra State Board or any other recognized equivalent Board / Authority.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

- Copy of duly filled pre-admission registration form of the University of Mumbai.
- College admission forms to be filled at the college website.
- Two passport-size photographs.
- Duly self-attested Copy of Aadhar Card.
- Original mark sheet of S. S. C. / H. S. C. with two attested photocopies.
- Original Leaving Certificate of last school/college attended with two attested photocopies.
- Two photocopies of Caste Certificate (if applicable).
- Candidates from other states will have to submit documents required for the eligibility certificate

ONLINE ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Candidates need to first fill in the pre-enrollment admission form on the University of Mumbai website (mum.digitaluniversity.ac) to apply for UG programmes. This is possible only when candidates have access to the login window of the University of Mumbai admission form.

Admission approval is based on the marks scored by the candidates in the qualifying examination. The printout of the application needs to be submitted in the college office. Applicants from states other than Maharashtra and foreign nations have to follow the same procedure for admission. Foreign students need to follow the additional mandatory procedure prescribed by the University of Mumbai.

- Facilitate students to submit online admission applications from anywhere by using the online student admission portal.

Note:

- Please note keep at least 10 attested copies of Standard XII Mark Sheet and Leaving Certificate for your future requirements.
- The Students belonging to SBC/SC/ST/VJNT, having income more than 4.5 Lakhs are not eligible for the Government of India Post Metric Scholarship.
- The right to admission is absolutely reserve with the Principal. There will be no automatic admission or promotion to subsequent year for the students of any class. It will be, however, be dependent on the following factors:
 - I. Admission/promotion is given to the subsequent year subjected to the fulfillment of conditions specified in the examination.
 - II. Regular attendance.
 - III. Discipline in the class and college campus.
 - IV. Respect shown to Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff.
 - V. Within Seven Days from the declaration of results students should fill fresh admission form.
 - VI. List of eligible students granted admission will be displayed on notice board.
 - VII. The term fees will have to be paid by the student on the day as per the notification of the admission put up on the college notice board.
 - VIII. Admission given to the student in this college, any class, will be on the basis of the rules and regulations prescribed by the college/University of Mumbai / Government of Maharashtra from time to time.

Status of Admission:

1. All admissions will be treated as provisional until all the necessary certificate, documents are submitted and approved by appropriate authority.
2. No admission will be regarded as proper unless it is granted by authority of the Principal.
3. All admissions will be valid for one academic year and requires renewal for each subsequent year.
4. Admission to this college will be as per the admission norms prescribed by the University of Mumbai.

PAYMENT OF FEES(QR CODE AVAILABLE)

- Fees must be paid on or before due date.
- Candidate should write their name, reference number and contact number on back side of the cheque.
- Candidate should preserve the original fee receipts.

This system enables students to accumulate credits based on their course selection and performance, fostering a more personalized learning experience and giving them the ability to choose subjects aligned with their interests and career goals.

Passing Standard :

Credit : 02 (Total 50 Marks) The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e., 08 out of 20) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e., 12 Out of 30) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes individually in the Internal Assessment as well as Semester End Examination.

Credit : 04 (Total 100 Marks) The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e., 16 out of 40) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e., 24 Out of 60) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E to pass a particular semester A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes individually in the Internal Assessment as well as Semester End Examination.

Verification of Marks

Students of First Year and Second Year can seek verification of marks / revaluation / photocopy of answer books by making an application within a stipulated time of the declaration of the said examination results .

Use of Unfair means at the Examination

Students of the degree college who are found adopting unfair means during examinations,

tutorials, practical etc. will be dealt with as per the University Rules, MU Act 1994 and the provision of Act No. XXXI/1982 as the case may be. The Board categorized malpractice and the quantum of punishment thereof are laid in the **University Ordinance 5050**.


Issue of Duplicate Mark Sheet

As per the University Circular No. Cert./Conv./1058 of 2008 dated 26th November 2008 the student who intend to apply for duplicate copies of their statement of marks, certificates of passing, degree certificates as well as special certificates should produce an affidavit on a non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.50/- made in that behalf before the Metropolitan Magistrate or Notary appointed by the Government to that effect, the reason for issue of duplicate copy of the aforesaid documents mentioning therein along with, the First Information Report (F.I.R) registered in the Police Station for the reasons whatsoever, i.e. loss, damage of the same, etc. to check the misuse of the aforesaid documents. On completion of these formalities and payment of necessary fees, the required duplicate certificates will be issued to the concerned students accordingly.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

DISCIPLINE/CODE OF CONDUCT

- Every student must possess a valid Identity Card issued to him/her by the college authority with a photograph and bearing the signature of the Principal. The student must carry their ID card in college premises either with cling or clip. A student without an Identity Card, entry in the college campus is prohibited and is liable for disciplinary action and will not be allowed to use of any facilities offered by the college.
- In the event of loss of the Identity Card the concerned student must make a written application and lodge an FIR and submit the copy of the FIR to the college office for issuance of duplicate Identity Card.
- Every student is responsible to take care of college property and help in keeping the college premises clean. No student should misuse black boards, disfigure wall and windows, tamper with furniture and fittings or cause any damage to the college property, either directly or indirectly.
- No student is allowed to communicate any information or write to the press about matters relating to the college administration without the permission of the Principal. Any student found guilty of disobedience, misconduct or misbehavior or any other act of serious indiscipline is liable to either lose his terms or face expulsion from the college.
- Smoking and spitting in the college premises is strictly prohibited. Students must be neatly and modestly dressed in the college premises.
- The use of mobile phones in the college premises is prohibited. Defaulters will be penalized as per the University rules.
- Regular attendance is mandatory (Minimum 75%).
- Students must carry their ID card at all times and show it on request.
- Political activities by students are strictly prohibited on campus.
- Students must maintain a respectful environment and avoid offensive comments about religion, caste and creed.
- Outsiders need prior permission from the college authorities to enter the campus.

- Keep the campus clean and use garbage bins for waste disposal.
 - Avoid gathering or roaming unnecessarily in the corridors.
 - Turn off lights and fans when leaving the classroom to save energy.
 - Check the notice board regularly to stay updated. Ignorance of notices is not an excuse.
 - Sloganeering or disrupting institutional activities is strictly prohibited.
 - For long medical absences, submit a doctor's prescription, medical certificate, and parents' request letter.
 - Be punctual and attend classes on time.
 - Seek permission before entering or leaving during lectures in emergency.
 - Ragging in any form is strictly banned. Violators will face severe action, including rustication.
 - Show respect and courtesy to teachers, staff, and fellow students. Rude behavior will be punished.
 - Handle college property carefully. Damage caused will result in fines for individuals or the entire class if unidentified.
 - Tobacco use in any form is strictly prohibited and will be penalized.
 - Mobile phones and electronic gadgets are not allowed in classrooms, examination halls, libraries, labs, or corridors. Violators will be penalized.
 - Dress in a simple and decent manner.
 - Carry your library card to issue or return books.
 - Do not use someone else's ID or library card.
 - Campus celebrations require prior approval from the Principal.
 - Any form of discrimination is strictly prohibited. Violators will face immediate action.
 - The wearing of any religious attire, such as saffron colour turbans & stoles, nawari sari, burqas or similar items, is not permitted within the college classrooms. Students' faces should be clearly visible in the college premises for the safety purpose. This rule is implemented to maintain a neutral and inclusive environment that emphasizes academic and professional standards over personal or religious expression. All students are expected to adhere to this policy to ensure uniformity and harmony on campus.

ATTENDANCE

- For granting the terms in each semester it is mandatory for every learner to have minimum 75% average attendance of total number of lectures, practicals, tutorials, etc. and a minimum of 50% attendance for each subject (0.6086).
- Attendance defaulters list will be put up on the Attendance Notice Board in the first week of every month for the period up to the previous month and warning letters will be issued to the defaulting learners twice in every semester.
- Student shall not be absent from tests or tutorials & examinations

RAGGING

Students should refrain from ragging within or outside the College premises. Government of Maharashtra by resolution no. tern/1 0967620/96 dated 06-09-1996 has notified ragging as a cognizable offence. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within or outside the College campus shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment and fine. Any student convicted shall be dismissed from the College and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal. The following are some of the ingredients of ragging, which are punishable under the court of law as per the "UGC Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009":

- i. Abetment to ragging,
- ii. Criminal conspiracy to rag
- iii. Unlawful assembly and rioting
- iv. Public nuisance created during ragging
- v. Violation of decency and moral thought
- vi. Injury to body
- vii. Wrongful restrain
- viii. Wrongful confinement
- ix. Use of criminal force
- x. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences
- xi. Extortion
- xii. Criminal trespass
- xiii. Offences against property
- xiv. Criminal intimidation, etc.

OTHER FACILITIES

1. Library & Reading Room: The College has a spacious reading room & rich collection of reference books & text books.
2. Computer Lab: The College has four computer labs with more than 106 branded new i5 and i7 Computers with internet connectivity exclusively for the research & training of our students.
 3. Seminar Hall: The College has a spacious seminar hall with all modern in built audio visual equipment.
 4. Canteen: The College has canteen on the ground floor which offers a variety of food items at concessional rates.
 5. Sports: The College provides the facilities for conducting of various sports events like Cricket, Football, Kabaddi, Table Tennis, Badminton, Carrom. The College has a spacious Turf and playground for training the students in various outdoor sports/games.
 6. Gymkhana: The College maintains a well-equipped Gymkhana with a lot of indoor game facilities.

7. Cultural Activities: The College believes in an all-round development of the student & hence provides various literary, cultural, semi arts activities to boost their talents & develop a competitive spirit. Every year we organize FREAK – Inter Collegiate Cultural & Sports **festival** which attracts huge response.

A candidate for being eligible for admission to this course shall have passed XII Standard Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education with the Science or Commerce stream or its equivalent with Mathematics as one subject .

OR

Candidates who have passed Diploma in Computer Engineering/Computer Science/ Computer Technology/Electrical, Electronics and Allied branches, Mechanical and Allied branches, Civil and Allied branches of Engineering are eligible for admission to the First year of the B.Sc. (IT) degree course. However, the Diploma should be recognized by the board of Technical Education or any recognized government body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for Open Category candidates and 40% aggregate for Reserved Category candidates.

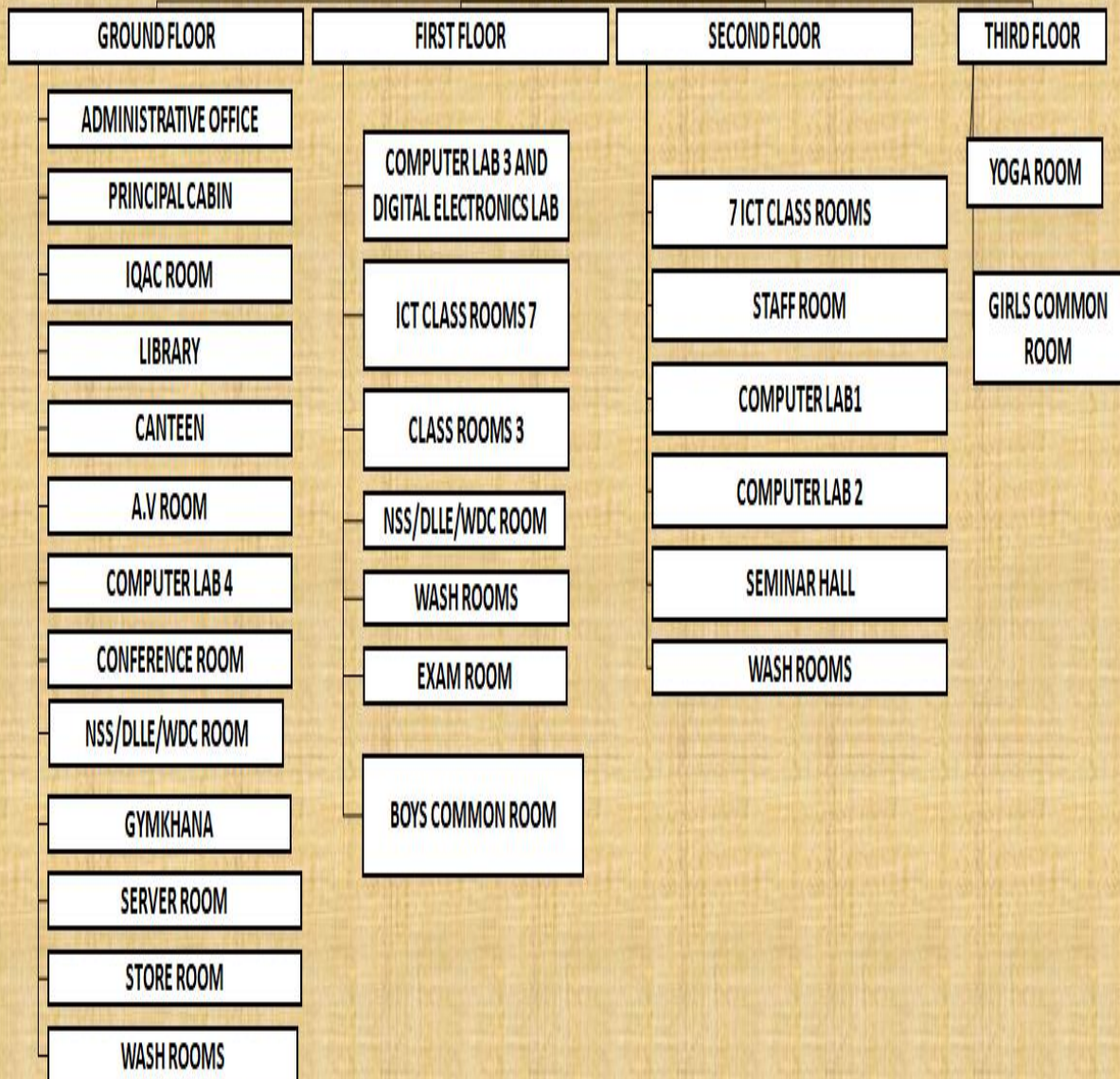
